Activities on 2nd March are in celebration of St David the Welsh Patron Saint.

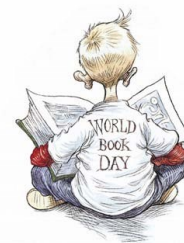


World Book Day
