<u>YEAR SIX:</u> This week Year 6 have been keeping their arithmetic up to speed by completing the Fluent in Five, and tackling the fractions and consecutive number reasoning activities on the 'I See Maths' website. In English, we have read a variety of Diaries from WWII and unpicked the specific vocabulary used before answering questions about the authors and their feelings at the time. We have also been honing our detective skills by using clues in a picture of a very strange shop named 'The Cabinet of Curiosities' and continuing a story start about its sudden appearance.
