Music

Intent - What do we aim to deliver?

We aim to engage, motivate and inspire pupils to develop a love of music and their talent as musicians

Children should develop a critical engagement with music, allowing them to compose, and to listen with discrimination

Children use a range of vocabulary to describe what they can hear.

Children will have chance to listen to a wide variety of music, play untuned and tuned instruments .

Children will sing, compose their own music and learn to read and write musical notation .

Children will learn to recognise and comment on the interrelated dimensions of music .



Implementation - How do we aim to deliver it?

Music lessons are focused on the children learning to behave as musicians and therefore music teaching at St Luke's C.E. Primary is practical and engaging where the dominant language of every music lesson is music; both listening to it and creating it.

Lessons will involve a combination of the following; games, songs, challenges, listening to music and discussing music, playing a range of musical instruments, performing back, finding the pulse and composing music using notation sheets.

Teachers will use 'Charanga', 'Music Express', 'BBC Bring the Noise' and 'Ten Pieces' resources to support planning and provide resources.

Open ended tasks will be provided that can have a variety of responses and teachers will also differentiate activities using the Charanga Bronze, Silver and Gold challenges.

Impact - How will we know we have delivered it?

The majority of children in each year group are working at or above the expected level for their age.

All children will have opportunities to perform their work to others.

Children will be able to work, talk and create like a musician

Children will be able to talk about the vocabulary used and explain what each term means.

Children who are "working towards" and at "greater depth" are recorded in order to track progression and provide intervention where appropriate. Teachers make use of "know more remember more" in order to consolidate the children's understanding.
